Course Objectives	The study of the subject Alternative Dispute Resolution will enable students: - to get acquainted with the pros of alternative dispute resolution (mediation, conciliation, arbitration, arbitration-mediation, mini-trial, early neutral assessment, settlement week), the legal framework of the ADR, advantages over court proceedings, their effects, ethical dilemmas in mediation, etc. There is a skills-orientated emphasis, designed not only to expose students to the practical skills required during negotiations and mediations, but also to provide a theoretical context for such skills and the analytical skills to adapt to various circumstances. Particular emphasis is placed on developing group, inter-personal and problemsolving skills. Students will also be able to develop a range of broader, transferable life skills for dealing with issues of professional and personal life, including: basic negotiation and mediation skills; a methodical approach to problem solving; confidence in oral communication; working effectively in teams; and the importance
