Course Objectives	To gain in-depth knowledge of the basic philosophical problems and the most important philosophical ideas in Western European philosophy, to develop the ability to compare historically different philosophical concepts, to develop the ability to interpret, analyze and evaluate authentic philosophical texts secondary literature, to strengthen one's own philosophical thought through communication with the ideas of philosophers, in the form of written exposition and / or verbal argumentation.
Course Contents	Basic problems of philosophy, directions and disciplines of philosophy, the relationship of philosophy and other sciences, the relationship of philosophy with psychology; ancient, Hellenistic-Roman philosophy, medieval, Byzantine, medieval and modern philosophy. The views of modern science on the soul-body relationship, as well as the possible answers to the questions whether the answer to the question of the soul lies in the origin and functions of consciousness, are presented through the insights of the authors Daniel Dennett, John Searle and David Chalmers. At the end of this course we talk about the search for the neural correlates of consciousness and the open questions about the possibility of creating artificial intelligence and artificial mind.
